Does your community group...

- have a nominated e-safety co-ordinator?

- have the necessary acceptable use policies?

- check that appropriate e-safety procedures and practices are in place and working?

- use an accredited supplier for internet services?

- include e-safety as part of your inspection evidence?

- keep a log to record and monitor e-safety incidents?

- raise awareness of e-safety issues by holding workshops and events?
